I had the freedom to choose my tasks according to my strengths and preferences. Here are some of my activities:

- Passing on the crochet technique and developing a learning concept
- Helping two 11-year-old girls with homework and introducing them to crochet
- Improving my English skills for communication and teaching the technical terms

• - Demonstration of various crochet applications such as flowers, bracelets and key rings

- - Encouraging the development of creative ideas and supporting their implementation
- - Organizing a sales stand and conducting sales trials
- - Creating a travel blog and generating donations
- Setting up a WhatsApp business account and establishing contacts with tour guides and the women at the center
- Development of an efficient support concept for the organization according to the "Walt Disney method"
- 2a. My main areas were:
- My main tasks were to teach crocheting at the women's center and speak English at the same time. In doing so, I built strong relationships by having face-to-face conversations, communicating via WhatsApp and spending time with the women outside of working hours. I also lived with the family of the founder Tamanna Bhati, her husband Raj and their 11-year-old daughter Gunjan.

- The openness of the Saahas sisters to show me their homes and introduce me to their families
- Designing my hands and feet with henna

- Life in the Indian family, being seen as a family member, being called Grandmother to Gunjan even to the outside world, Tamanna was happy to join my own 3 German children as my daughter. Raj didn't want to be a son-in-law, but also a son. That's how I ended up with an Indian family of choice.

My goal was to contribute my talents while taking into account the needs of the women, which I definitely achieved. The women have not only learned a specific handicraft, but have gained a technique with which they can make a variety of products. I was also able to improve my English skills and teach them to both the women and the girls.

Immersing myself in the Indian way of life. Getting to know the culture. The daily bus ride to the NGO was with locals - there wasn't a single tourist on the bus. Living on the outskirts of the city, playing with the neighboring children, celebrating Hindi festivals on the street with the neighbors
